The Tsi-/G- Set Pronouns are used on most intransitive Imperfective Stem verbs. The Imperfective Habitual verb refers to a situation that recurs consistently, everyday, for example. The Tsi-/G- Set of Pronouns is so called because of the sound form of the First Person Singular 'T'.

There are 10 Tsi-/G- Set Pronouns. If you know the First Person Singular and the Third Person Singular, you can predict the other 8 pronouns.

1. tsi- 'T'; a- 'she/he'	2. tsi- 'T'; ga- 'he/she'	3. g- 'T'; a- 'she/he'	4. g- 'T'; g- 'he/she'
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We will work with First Person Singular 'T' and Second Person Singular 'you' pronouns.

gadawosgo'i	hadawosgo'i	bathe/swim

galsdayvhvsgo'i	halsdayvhvsgo'i	eat a meal
gaditasgo'i	haditasgo'i	drink
gagvsgwosgo'i/tsigvsgwosgo'i	hagvsgwosgo'i	wash face
degasulesgo'i	dehisulesgo'i	wash hands
galsgisgo'i	halsgisgo'i	dance
tsiluhgo'i	hiluhgo'i	arrive

Hvga iyuwanhilvhi hiyego'i?
Sudali ayeli iyuwanhilvhi tsiyego'i.

What time do you get up?
I get up at 6:30.

Hvga iyuwanhilvhi hadawosgo'i?
Gesdi yigadawosgo'i. Iyudaliha'i degasulesgo'i.

What time do you bathe?
I don't bathe. Sometimes I was my hands.

Gedo iyusdi haditasgo'i sunale alsdayhdi?
Yagineha, uwogihli gaditasgo'i.

What do you drink for breakfast?
If I have it, I drink beer.

Gedo iyusdi halsdayvhvsgo'i iga alsdayhdi?
Tuya disuyi gadu nole tsitaga gvtsahlav
galsdayvhvsgo'i iga alsdayhdi.

What do you eat for lunch?
I eat bean bread and fried chicken for
lunch.

Hvga iga halsgisgo'i?
Nigohilv Undadodagwidena usv'i galsgisgo'i.

When do you dance?
I dance every Saturday night.

Osdatsu halsgisgi?
Ni! Nihi sginohisi!

Are you a good dancer?
Look! You tell me!

The Imperfective Stem is used in Agent Nouns: galsgisgo'i 'I dance' ~ galsgisgi 'I am a dancer.'
