

Create 8 panels that might be turned into a book. Create a title page, a back cover, and 6 pages of content. Fill in a short discussion between at least three characters. Cherokee language has 10 Person Reference Pronoun Categories. In order to cover the 10 Person Reference Pronoun Categories, we ask you to complete dialogues that involve multiple Person Sets.

The 10 Person Reference Pronoun Categories are

First Person Singular I, me		Second Person Singular you	Third Person Singular she/he/it, her/him/it
First Person Exclusive Dual I and she/he, me and him/her	First Person Inclusive Dual I and you, me and you	Second Person Dual you and she/he, you and her/him	
First Person Exclusive Plural I and they, me and them	First Person Inclusive Plural I and you and he/she/they, me and you and him/her/them	Second Person Plural you and they, you and them	Third Person Plural they, them

1. Create a front cover / title page, six interior numbered pages, and a back cover. Fill in the six content pages with characters and dialogue. Write in a short dialogue between three characters. Work neatly but don't worry about aesthetics.

Front Cover Title: Decide on a Cherokee title. Use Cherokee language only throughout.

Suggestions –

Title: Siyo!

Page 1: Characters say hello.

Page 2, 3, 4: Characters exchange names.

Page 5, 6: Characters ask after each other's health – Osigwutsu? Tohigwutsu? Hayoldatsu? [Perhaps order of pages may be shifted – Page 2, 3 health, Page 4, 5, 6 exchange names.]

Helpful vocabulary to extend the story line:

Tsayosihatsu?	Are you hungry?	Uyosihatsu?	Is she/he hungry?
Tsatadegi'atsu?	Are you thirsty?	Utadegi'atsu?	Is he/she thirsty?
Agiyosiha.	I am hungry.	Agtadegi'a.	I am thirsty.
Tsayosiha.	You are hungry.	Tsatadegi'a.	You are thirsty.
Uyosiha.	She/he is hungry.	Utadegi'a.	He/she is thirsty.
