Tsi-/G- Set Pronouns

The Tsi-/G- Set Pronouns are used on most intransitive Present Stem verbs. The Tsi-/G- Set Pronouns are used on most transitive Present Stem verbs that refer to an Inanimate Undergoer. The Tsi-/G- Set Pronouns are so called because of the sound form of the First Person Singular 'I'.

There are 10 Tsi-/G- Set Pronouns in Consonant and Vowel Stem forms. If you know the First Person Singular and the Third Person Singular, you can predict the other 8 pronouns.

tsi- 'I' ~ a- 'she/he'	tsi- 'I' ~ ga- 'he/she'	g- 'I' ~ a- 'she/he'	g- 'I' ~ g- 'he/she'
